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# SUSSEX PUB SCRATCHINGS

News of new developments and updates on the Sussex pub scene will be gratefully received by the Editor for consideration in Scratchings. The standard disclaimer on p30 applies to all items.

Special restrictions may apply, opening hours may be different to those displayed here, and some pubs may be yet to re-open at all. Please use [WhatPub.com](http://WhatPub.com) for details of all Sussex pubs, and we've made every effort to ensure details on WhatPub are accurate, however we strongly advise checking ahead before visiting, by phone, website or Facebook page.

## ■ ALFRISTON

Probably everyone in East Sussex knows about the **Star's** complex makeover from Channel Five's series. New owners, Olga and Alex Polizzi, mother and daughter, television hosts, hoteliers and heirs to the Rocco Forte estate, spent a year and a half transforming the old Star Inn into a modern laid-back-but-lovely country hotel, using local craftsmen and materials where possible, including wallpaper from Hastings! The new courtyard, with tables and seating, now backs onto the extensively beamed old bar, which stocks Harvey's Best Bitter.

## ■ ARLINGTON

(north west of Polegate)

New people took over the rural **Old Oak Inn**, adjacent to Abbot's Wood, Caneheath late in 2020. There's a good atmosphere with pub meals and real ales from Harvey's and Long Man, plenty of outside tables in the gardens, plus a play area.

In Arlington village the **Yew Tree Inn**, also in new hands, has a similar format: fresh local food, Harvey's Best Bitter and a garden.

## ■ BATTLE

In the Spring, Battle Brewery's shop, 52 High Street, expanded when the adjoining empty shop premises was added on. Now a micropub, taproom and bottle shop, it's open 11 am to 9 pm, seven days a week, with cask and craft-keg Battle Brewery and guest ales. Located alongside a host of local retailers, it's a welcome addition to the town.

## ■ BELLS YEW GREEN

Over the weekend of 10th September the **Brecknock Arms** held a beer festival featuring around a dozen brews from Sussex and Kent breweries. The bar was set up in the large shelter, built during the pandemic in the garden. Their usual Harvey's beers (Sussex Best and IPA) were also served in good condition. Judging by the numbers attending on the Friday afternoon, the event promised to be a resounding success and it's hoped will become a regular fixture in the small festival calendar.

## ■ BEXHILL

Spacious former cinema, the **Picture Playhouse** (JDW), now includes local beers whose quality has recently been excellent.

The **Sportsman** has three real ales on offer including Long Man Long Blonde.

**Traffers Bar** sold take-outs during lockdowns and now offers three real ales, mainly from local breweries.




At the **Albatross Club** things have settled down following the departure of Karen as the Club Steward.

Beer range and quality having been excellent on recent visits. Five real ales and

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two real ciders are now served. The main room, including the toilets, have been fully refurbished. Well done to everyone for ensuring this excellent Club remains so superb.

The **Brickmakers Alehouse** is back to serving five real ales and four real ciders.



A highlight for the local branch was when a CAMRA Design Award for Conversion to Pub Use was presented to this micropub, which opened in November 2019. This was an online event with members

gathering in the pub around a screen and camera, giving the pub enthusiastic support via Zoom. Branch members definitely claim they gave the best support out of the seven pubs winning awards online. Bexhill should definitely be a stopping off point for Members' Weekend visitors in April 2022, with two national award-winning locations close to the station.

### ■ BILLINGSHURST

A new micro pub, the **Billi Tap**, opened on Billingshurst High Street at the end of July. It features cask and keg ales from Little Monster and Brolly brewing, and is a great addition to the local beer scene.

### ■ CROWBOROUGH

The **White Hart on the Green** is one of the comfortable pubs owned by Stonegate. Although it hasn't featured on CAMRA's radar for some time it now has a new manager in charge of the bar who's passionate about real ale. He's from a London pub that had lots of interaction with CAMRA members, and he's keen for

this to continue at the White Hart. Regular beers are Harvey's Sussex Best along with the inevitable Sharpe's Doom Bar, with the intention of featuring a changing guest ale from one of our many good local breweries. The pub accepts CAMRA discount tokens and runs occasional offers. A restaurant area and a large car park feature.

### ■ EASTBOURNE

All Good Beer Guide and major real ale pubs in the area survived pandemic restrictions and difficulties. Summer turned out busy with staycation holidaymakers but few of the usual international visitors and language students. Currently pubs are facing more difficulties with deliveries, staff shortages and they often offer a smaller range of ales. The CAMRA-assisted 'Beer and Cider by the Sea' festival was a success, held on the seafront lawns in mid-August.

**Ninkaci** is a new craft ale bar, predominantly key-keg, proving popular with an ever-changing line-up. Located on the ground floor of the Enterprise Centre, adjacent to Eastbourne Station, it's open from 11 am to 8 pm Tuesday to Saturday, and 6 pm on Sundays.

After closure and a string of small fires, assumed to be arson, the **Alexandra Arms**, in Seaside, reopened with new management this summer.

The **Crown**, in the heart of the Old Town, held a superb August Bank Holiday beer festival with local bands playing on a stage in the garden. The landlord is to be commended for all the work that went into it, including personally driving around collecting casks from breweries when deliveries were unreliable.

### ■ FAIRLIGHT

(on the cliffs east of Hastings)

When the **Cove** closed its doors in 2016 it left the village without a pub for five years. Excellent news: it will shortly reopen, having been purchased by the owner of the Crown in Hastings Old Town and extensively refurbished. Planning permission has been granted for the addition of an annexe providing six en-suite bedrooms.

### ■ FAYGATE

The **Frog and Nightgown** has been extended and now has a small Italian restaurant as an annex to the pub.

### ■ FERRING

The **Rassasy Farm Shop Snug Bar** farm produce and deli business recently opened The Snug at the rear of the shop. This small bar serves drinks from local brewers, including keg beers, ciders and bottled beers. A selection of cheese and deli board snacks available.

### ■ FRAMFIELD

In early September service at the **Hare & Hounds** was still restricted to the marquee and garden. However, this did not deter customers, and this rural local was reasonably busy for a Thursday afternoon visit. Unfortunately Three Acre's Hazy Pale had just finished but Harvey's Sussex Best was an excellent alternative in very good condition.

### ■ HORSHAM

Delighted that the **Anchor Tap** is due to reopen in the Autumn under the management of Sam and his team from the **Malt Shovel**. Great news indeed.

## ■ NETHERFIELD



The **White Hart Inn** has become a well-appointed gastropub, now owned by local farmers. Located on high ground with spectacular views it's open Wednesday to Sunday. At weekends Asado (South American) Barbecue is a speciality. Harvey's Best is the regular with the intention of more real ales to follow. [www.white-hart-netherfield.co.uk](http://www.white-hart-netherfield.co.uk).

### ■ PETT

The grade II listed **Royal Oak** was reopened in April by two local brothers, Robin and Joseph Lyons. They serve Harvey's Sussex Best Bitter and up to three changing local and regional brews along with a full menu of pub dishes and tapas.

Nearby at Pett Level, the **Smuggler** closed in 2017 and was the subject of a failed enterprise to convert to a doctor's surgery. The large garden at the rear, entered from the promenade, is now open for food and non-alcoholic drinks. The building itself should reopen in 2022 as a restaurant with holiday accommodation.

### ■ RUSTINGTON

The **Georgi Fin** opened in August 2020 after lockdown but is now thriving and well worth a visit. It is in a former electrical shop which was fully refitted with a similar interior theme to the micropub with the same name in Goring.

## ■ RYE

The **Waterworks** provided take-outs during lockdowns, which was greatly appreciated by locals. This micropub now serves nine real ales plus real ciders from their chilled cabinet.

## ■ ST LEONARDS ON SEA

A lot of changes are happening in St Leonards.

In the Silverhill neighbourhood the **Duke** was refurbished during the first lockdown and now offers two Gun beers.

The **Welcome** is very busy with diners and now offers three Long Man beers.

The **North Star** has been refurbished inside and out and should be open by the time you read this.

At the **Tower** - with six real ales and as many ciders - locals are really enjoying this excellent pub once more, thanks to Louisa and her superb staff.

Tucked one road back from London Road, the **Nag's Head** has been completely refurbished. Now run by Dee and Don, who've gone out of their way to create an inviting atmosphere, it's gaining a reputation for excellent quality. Up to five real ales are offered with changing options: recently three were from Battle Brewery. Quiz nights and music nights are regular features.

Nearby the **Piper** is finally open, and serves two real ales: it was closed throughout most of 2020.



Also in Norman Road, the **Three Legs @ Heist Market** is Three Legs Brewery's new taproom featuring not just all their own, but also craft ales from other respected producers.



A host of other fashionable 'foodie' and drink venues share the market style interior in the former Midland Bank, including Japanese, Natural Wine,

Seafood and Coffee businesses.

The **Marina Fountain**, closed Monday and Tuesday, offers two real ales, often from local breweries.



'Nothing beats a pub lunch' according to the Weekend FT, which went on to recommend the **Royal**, St John's Road, right outside Warrior Square's westbound platform. Now a gastropub, it picked up a Michelin Bib Gourmand award for 'exceptional food at a moderate price'. Local members tell us that their real ale is indeed affordable and worth sampling, with beers, just one at a time so far, often from St Austell and Oakham. Drinkers are welcomed, even when just changing trains. It's run by a team of friends who've all worked at top London restaurants; it's been open, outside of lockdowns, since late 2019. ([www.theroyalstleonards.co.uk](http://www.theroyalstleonards.co.uk)).

### ■ SALEHURST

The **Salehurst Halt** remains a very busy country pub with excellent food and superb real ales.

### ■ SHOREHAM-BY-SEA

The **Red Lion** has reopened after its long re-fit, with new management, and two interesting cask beers were on, from Long Man and Bedlam. It is still a free house, a little less 'olde-worldly' than before but perhaps more comfortable and the bar has moved to the top room.

### ■ SOUTHWICK

The **Schooner** is still closed and rumours that it may be a restaurant have not been denied – no response to a recent e-mail so, who knows?

### ■ WORTHING

The **Brewhouse & Kitchen** brewpub opened in May 2021 after significant refurbishment and extension of the former Beechwood Hall Hotel. There are many tables inside and in the large garden. A range of beers are brewed on the premises by an enthusiastic brewer plus beers from other suppliers. Usual B&K food offerings available, booking recommended at busy times. This is the first B&K brewpub which also has a number of hotel rooms so is described by them as a BrewTel.

**Brooksteed Alehouse** is keeping table service for a while since it has removed queues at the bar whilst also keeping a sensible level of covid precautions. They operate a web-based ordering system using phone/tablet, but the bar staff will place an order for you if are unable to do so. Card payments only.


The **Selden Arms** deserves a special mention as it ran an ale delivery service throughout the lockdowns (and still is at the time of writing) managing to keep 6 cask ales available almost all that time. As a result of the support from regulars, this pub has not taken any government money in furlough or other support during the

pandemic. The pub is open with table service only at present, maintaining a sensible level of Covid precautions.

The **Fox & Finch Alehouse** was awarded branch POTY literally a week before the first lockdown but is open again and well worth a visit. Fallen Acorn's Pompey Royal is regularly on cask.

The Hand in Hand pub in Brighton started brewing many years ago but having outgrown the premises, they opened the **Hand Brew Co Tap** brewery and tap room in West Worthing in 2021, although small batch and specials are still brewed in Brighton. Housed in an industrial unit it also has canning and bottling facilities shared with Cloak and Dagger Brewing. The tap room is open limited hours with outside seating and food from the Curry Leaf Café's street trailer is usually available.

## The Sussex Breweries Pages

Information here is generally supplied by the Brewery Liaison Officers (BLOs) named at the end of each report. The Brewery Liaison Coordinator for the Surrey, Sussex and Kent Area is Peter Page-Mitchell. #### *East Hoathly*

Bottle sales are strong given that more people are still choosing to drink at home. The brewery is keeping four (double dropped) beers available; **Triple Champion** 4.0%, **Lammas** 4.2%, **Signature** 4.4%, **Bee Head** 4.6%. They will be brewing **Laughing Frog** 5.2% and **Hop Pocket** 3.7% again in the near future.

A range of brewery beers are available in the Kings Head bar which has recently been redecorated with this year's just cut Sussex Hops from Burwash.

#### **BLO Barry Blewitt**

### 360 DEGREES BREWING

#### *Sheffield Park*

The brewery site has been expanded increasing space by a factor of 1.8. This has



allowed for new vessels and an increased brewing schedule. There is a new cold store which will double as a cellar for the new tap room being constructed. My estimate is that it will accommodate 70 plus visitors including the outdoor space available. Demand has prevented developing a seasonal cask offering so currently four core cask offerings: **Bluebell Best, Fastback APA, Session Pale Ale and Double Act** all of which were available at the inaugural Bluebell Beer Festival sited next to the Brewery.

### ABYSS

#### *Framfield*

The brewery has now relocated to the Davey's Lane area of Lewes. The last few months have been spent installing the

brewhouse in the old Maltings building, previously part of the South Downs Brewery, and building the new taproom. This should be completed in the next few weeks. In the meantime, several new beers have been introduced. All the beers are produced in rotation according to demand and full details of availability and home delivery are on the website. No cask beers are produced yet.

#### *Ford, Nr Arundel*

Arundel Brewery have been brewing at full capacity at their Ford site over the Summer months but will shortly be adding more capacity via their new 7bbl brewkit at their Brewhouse Project taproom site, where they will be focussed on brewing fruited sour ales & pastry stouts.

Balcombe brewery commenced brewing during the last lockdown (2020-21) their objective is to supply beer to the Half Moon Inn in Balcombe, The brewing team are a volunteer group drawn from the community. The description 'small' suits the brewery as there is enough room for the brewer to work surrounded by the brewery. Currently they brew three beers all

packaged as keg, **American Pale** (APA, 4.5%), **Session IPA** (IPA 4.5%) and **Hoppy Lager** (Lager 4.5%). The intention was to brew to cask however sales of the keg version have outstripped their supply! The locals in the Half Moon Inn (community owned) have taken these beers with gusto and their own fonts have replaced those of well-known mass-produced fizz.

##### *Battle*

**Tostig** their extra pale ale has returned! This special beer has been an interesting challenge as they had to make some changes to the hops to get it right! They have created a light, refreshing, extra pale ale, hopped with some big hitting American varieties to bring a fruity aroma and a floral citrus flavour. The feedback has been amazing and the next batch will be moving to Battle too. Speaking of which all their bottle range is bigger than ever: **1066 Lager, Abbey Pale, Conquest, Alan the Red, One Hop Wonder, Fyrd's Gold, Black Arrow** and their new **Senlac Imperial Stout**. The brewery tap room is only open on Saturday. This limited opening has run in conjunction with the High Street bottle shop and tap room. Two local outlets are extremely popular.

#### **BLO Mac McCutcheon**

#### **BEER ME**

##### *Eastbourne*

Beer.me have increased their range to 15 beers, with ten being on Tap at Belgian Cafe. Their three new craft beers are beers with a fruit twist according to the Belgian tradition: **RnB** is a blonde base beer featuring raspberries; **Summer Breeze** is packed with red fruits; and **The Dark Side of The Fruit** being a darker beer with strawberry hints. The brewery launched an online service, where from the 10th of September they'll be able to send their beer all over the UK direct to doorstep.

##### *Eridge Green*

Benchmark Brewery is continuing to work hard to keep up with the demand for their range of bottle conditioned beers. Some cask conditioned versions have been produced recently with these being snapped up by private parties, wedding receptions, etc. locally. They are due to provide some cask beer to the upcoming Spa Valley Beer Festival at the beginning of October and will be looking to get their beer into selected local pubs in the near future.

It had been run on a temporary licence, but now an application for a permanent one has been approved.

Burning Sky's Brewer, Mark Tranter, reports that they have been overwhelmed by

support from the on-trade as pubs gradually reopened. Cask was hit and miss for a while, in terms of ordering, so they concentrated on Plateau to make sure it was as they would want it in peak condition every time. As things normalised, they have brewed **Aurora** again; a joy for them and their customers. They will continue with those, and maybe some specials and definitely seasonal beers in cask.

All their beers, including cask, are now vegan. They have found a way to ensure their beers are 'pin bright' without the use of traditional finings.

750ml releases recently have been **Cuvée Reserve 2020/21** (a possible swansong as they have not been able to bring lambic over from Belgium due to Covid-19 in the short term and Brexit in the long term), and **Full Circle**, in collaboration with Thornbridge. An aged saison with sour cherries is next up, with their annual coolship release following. Keg and canned beers remain very strong both locally and nationally, with **Arise** having been flying out.

Ground was broken on the new 6,000 sq ft brewery build back in September 2020. One year on and the finishing touches are being added.

The plan allows for a coldstore, production space and a shop / taproom. The taproom will have large windows looking into the production space, meaning that you should be able to visit the brewery and enjoy a

pint whilst watching the brewers at work.

A new 30hl three vessel brew kit is being installed, along with two new 9000l fermenters. This kit, along with the efficiency gains from working in a custom designed space, will allow production capacity to triple.

The brewery is hoping to open its doors to the public this side of Christmas 2021. To keep up to date on progress, you can go to their website, or better still sign up for their newsletter.

Harvey's head brewer, Miles Jenner, reports being pleasantly surprised at the Brewery's recovery from Covid-19. New products are planned that will see them brewing some very different styles in the coming months. A collaboration with Burning Sky will see their

brewer, Mark Tranter, visit Harvey's to brew something distinct using Harvey's unique yeast strain.

The brewery did not enter any beer competitions in 2020 due to Covid-19. So they are even more delighted to have been awarded Country Winner for their **1859 Porter, Imperial Extra Double Stout, and Prince of Denmark** in the World Beer Awards 2021. Silver was awarded for **Christmas Ale** and **Elizabethan Ale** and Bronze for **Best Bitter** and **Sweet Sussex**. In the next two rounds all Country Winners will complete to become the World's Best in their style and category with results expected on 9 September. In the British Beer Bottlers' Institute Competition Harvey's were awarded Gold for both **Elizabethan Ale** and **Lewes Castle Brown Ale** with Diplomas being awarded for another five of their beers.

After a year of uncertainty and set backs, some business rationalisation has been necessary to equip them for the future. One opportunity has been to integrate a smaller technical services department within the production team. Overall, there has been a small reduction in staff numbers across the Brewery and Estate. They plan to use a new marquee with it being erected for a variety of events in the Brewery yard over the coming year. Sadly,

they are unable to host the traditional "Dancing-in-of-the-Old" on the first Saturday of October but hope to do so next year. The need to prioritise staff and customer safety means that Brewery tours remain on hold for now.

Heathen Brewers have opened a new brewery and Tap Room called the Hop Sun in Triangle Road, Haywards Heath. The new brewery is based in a converted Victorian barn and incorporates mainly original architectural features. Beers on tap during the official opening included a **New England India Pale Ale** at 5% ABV along with a more traditional **India Pale Ale**, a West Coast style Pale Ale and a stout. The beers in the Tap Room are served from tanks using air pressure dispense with no CO<sup>2</sup> involved.

*Lower Beeding*

Much has changed over the last two years with a greater focus on developing the brewery as a venue.

Kissingate's quirky taproom has become a big attraction for the locals and those from further afield.

A scaled-back brewing schedule has allowed for more creativity with brews such as **Little Green Nutter** 5.0%, which is only available from the taproom. At least ten cask beers are always available including stouts, porters or milds. A new Beer called **Horsham Ditty Pale** 4.0% is a new creation celebrating the life and times of the Horsham songwriter, bellringer, and cobbler Harry Burstow. Kissingate first summer festival for two years was a huge success and a welcome back. Plans for an October festival are already underway with the date set for Saturday 9th October. ## A guide to cider in Worthing's micropubs - Part 2

(This is part 2 of an article, part 1 of which appeared in SD101 - Spring 2020)

So, progressing round Worthing's micropubs, we set out on my very first BTPP (Bus To The Pub) trip on Saturday 28th December to try 3 more.

First up was the Georgi Fin, which was already stuffed with stalwarts of the BTPP team. Very welcoming, very clear and informative boards about what was on offer, and a good range of ales and ciders. I stuck with a favourite, South Downs Dry cider (4.5%), and Roger sampled Loudshirt Ecstasy Stout 6.6% (just a half), and Ampersand Cocow 4.8% when that came on. I loved both his ales too! I also liked the reclaimed boards for benches and tables, though difficult for me to get my leg over.... (no sniggers, please).

A short walk from there to the Green Man Ale and Cider House, run by Les Johnson (no relation), and always a good selection of ales and ciders. Roger had Hurst Old Acquaintance 6.5%, and Hopback Pickled Santa 6% (both halves at that strength!), and I had Purbeck Dandy Dab and Burrow Hill Dry, both beautiful, and tempting to try more, but we still had another micro to try....

On to the Brooksteed Alehouse, close to Worthing station, where I had a choice of 2 Ascension ciders, plumping for the weaker (4%) and more interesting of them, Shimmy, which tasted more of the added fruit (pineapple) than the apple cider, but pleasant and refreshing. Roger had Sambrook's Powerhouse Porter, 4.9%, a lovely drink on which to finish. Thank you Aaron and John for a very pleasant finish to the day.

There still remained 2 more micropubs in Worthing, so yet another trip out was required on Saturday 18th January, this time



in the evening, arriving at the Fox and Finch about 8pm. The place was stuffed full when we arrived and well-



steamed up - could hardly see the bar! But it was well worth pushing through to it to see a phenomenal range of cask and keg ales, and ciders, and mead and gins on offer. Roger tried the Weltons Hot Chestnuts Porter, 5.5%, which I

sampled too - exceedingly nice - and I had Sandford Orchards Devon Scrumpy, 6%, also very good. Encountered Nigel and Debs from the Anchored in here. Conversation ensued with them and the landlady, which turned to the last micropub we had to visit, the Grizzly Bear: apparently no real ale or cider, so we chickened out of visiting this one and went for yet another drink in the Green Man again. Apologies for not visiting this last micro, but it was very noisy and very full as we went by!

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
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## A BLUEBELL RAILWAY FIRST

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

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
